



BYLAW NUMBER 282

A Bylaw of the Hamlet of Fort Liard in the Northwest Territories to establish and provide for the operation of fire for the Hamlet pursuant to provisions of the Hamlet Act, R.S.N.W.T., 2003, c.22, s3, s72 and s74, and the Summary Convictions Procedures Act, R.S.N.W.T., 1988, c.15, s11.

WHEREAS, the Hamlet of Fort Liard has the responsibility to develop and maintain a safe community;

WHEREAS, the Hamlet of Fort Liard has the authority to make bylaws respecting the safety, health and welfare of people and the protection of people and property within its boundaries;

WHEREAS, the Hamlet of Fort Liard deems it essential to establish the standards for the prevention, fighting, and suppression of fires, regulation of the duties and responsibilities of the Fire Department and to provide for fire services within the Hamlet.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE HAMLET OF FORT LIARD, at a duly constituted meeting, enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This Bylaw may be cited as the "Fire Protection Bylaw".

INTERPRETATION

- 2. In this Bylaw:
 - "Building" means a fixed structure in which people work or dwell;
 - "Fire Chief" means the Fire Chief Administrative Officer of the Hamlet of Fort Liard;
 - "Council" means the Council of the Hamlet of Fort Liard;
 - "Department" means the Department of the Hamlet of Fort Liard and includes any combination of full time, part time, or volunteer members;
 - "Emergency" means an unexpected situation that requires prompt action to protect human life and property;
 - "Equipment" means tools, contrivances, devices or materials used by the Fire Department to combat an incident or other Emergency;
 - "Fire Marshall" means the Fire Marshall appointed by the Commissioner of the Northwest Territories under the Fire Prevention Act. R.S.N.W.T.:
 - "Fire Protection" means all aspects of fire prevention including fire alarms, fire suppression, rescue first air, salvage, and public education and training;
 - "Fire Protection System" means water trucks, fire trucks, pump houses, under the control and maintenance of the Hamlet of Fort Liard;
 - "Hamlet" means the Hamlet of Fort Liard in the Northwest Territories;
 - "Hazardous Material" means a substance that when released can create harm to the public, the environment of property;
 - "Member" means a member of the Fire Department; other than the Fire Chief including volunteers while their services are engaged by the Hamlet of Fort Liard for the purpose of providing fire Emergency services;
 - "Officer" means a Member who is assigned an appointment of authority by the Fire Chief of the Fire Department,
 - "Schedule" means a schedule attached and forming part of this bylaw; and,
 - "Standard Operation Guidelines" means written operational guidelines, general orders or Department of Fire rules to be used to assist the department members in conducting department operations;

CREATION OF DEPARTMENT

3. A Fire Department for the Hamlet of Fort Liard shall be established and be comprised of a Fire Chief and other department personnel, officers, and volunteers as from time to time is deemed necessary by the Fire Chief and approved by Council. The Fire Department shall hereafter be referred to as the Department.

DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 3. Take appropriate measures for the prevention, control and extinguishment of fires and for the protection of life and property, in accordance with the Standard Level 2 Defensive as defined in <u>MACA Community Fire Protection Matrix</u>.
- 4. The Fire Department will provide Fire Protection at a level of service that is directly related to the current resources assigned to the Fire Department and the current Members' level of training and capacity, regardless of the level of service adopted.

DEPARTMENT MEMBERSHIP

- 5. The Department shall comprise of the Fire Chief and any other person appointed to serve under the terms of this bylaw.
- 6. Council shall appoint, by bylaw, a Fire Chief with authority under this bylaw.
- 7. The Fire Chief shall report to council through the Senior Administrative Officer.
- The Fire Chief shall also assume the responsibilities of the Local Assistant to the Fire Marshall.
- 9. Council, on recommendation of the Fire Chief, may appoint a member as an Officer to assist the Fire Chief in the performance of his duties with specific authority as defined by Council.
- Officers and members of the Department shall carry out the duties and responsibilities assigned to the Department by Council in adherence with the Department "<u>Code of Ethics</u>" ap per Appendix "A".
- 11. Council shall pay, on recommendation of the Fire Chief, what Council considers reasonable compensation to any member whose wearing appeal has been damaged in the course of responding to an incident.
- 12. The Hamlet shall pay for the cost of any medical examinations required.
- 13. Council shall pay for Accidental Death and Dismemberment Insurance while members are on duty or training.
- 14. When a member has a direct interest in the incident that the Department has responded to, the member will be required to step aside until the investigation has been resolved to the satisfaction of the Fire Chief.
- 15. Drugs and alcohol shall not be permitted in the fire hall or while operating Emergency response equipment.
- 16. Members believed to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol will not be permitted in the fire hall or to operate Emergency response equipment.

JURISDICTION

- 17. The limits of the jurisdiction of the Fire Chief, Officers, and Members will extend to all areas within the "Fire Protection Service Area" of the Hamlet as per Appendix "B".
- 18. No Department equipment or vehicles shall be used beyond the limits of the "<u>Fire Protection Service Area</u>" of the without Council approval.
- 19. Any authorization, written contract or agreement for providing for the supply of Emergency response services outside the established boundaries must be approved by Council.

ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

- 20. Council shall determine the types and level of service to be provided by the Department as well as the number of personnel, apparatus and equipment necessary to provide an adequate level of service for the protection of life and property.
- 21. Council shall not control or interfere with the day-to-day operations of the Department.

- 22. The Fire Chief shall administer and enforce the provisions of this bylaw. he Fire Chief shall be responsible for all administrative and operational matters and shall head the chain of command for the Department.
- 23. The Fire Chief shall establish and implement all the Department "<u>Standard Operating Guidelines</u>", general orders' and Department rules as necessary.
- 24. The Fire Chief shall assign designate specific Officers to command and control operations at fire scenes and other emergencies.

AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES

- 25. The Fire Chief and his designates shall wear a badge or display some device indicating their rank in the Department at fires or other emergencies.
- 26. No person shall falsely represent themselves as a Department member.
- 27. The Fire Chief and his designates shall command and control all operations in connection with the extinguishment and control of any fires or any other emergencies the Department may respond to and shall have authority to take all reasonable actions necessary to protect life and property.
- 28. The Fire Chief, his designates and the duly appointed members of the Department are authorized to carry out the following duties:
 - a) Command the assistance of persons and/or commandeer any vehicle, apparatus or equipment deemed necessary to extinguish and control any fire, explosion, hazardous materials incident, natural disaster, rescue operation, and other emergencies;
 - b) Remove any property, vehicle, combustible or hazardous materials from a building, property or area on fire or in danger thereof or at risk of a potential fire and explosion or threat from the spill of any hazardous materials;
 - c) Enter, break into or tear down any building on fire or in danger thereof or at risk of an explosion or threat from the spill of any hazardous materials:
 - d) Exclude persons and vehicles from the vicinity of a fire or area at risk of a potential fire, and explosion or threat from the spill of any hazardous materials or any area endangered by a disaster, or other Emergency; and.
 - e) Evacuate building or an area of all occupants endanger by a fire or the threat of a potential fire or explosion or area at risk of an explosion or threat from the spill of any hazardous materials.
- 29. The Fire Chief, his designates and the duly appointed members of the Department shall not be liable for any damage caused to any property as a result of carrying out the duties outlined in "<u>Authorities and "Duties</u>".
- 30. The Fire Chief, his designates or the duly appointed members of the Department charged with the control or extinguishment of any fire, explosion or the spill of any hazardous materials, rescue operation, or other Emergency, acting in good faith and without malice in the discharge of their duties, shall not thereby be rendered personally libel for damages, or injury of any person caused by the person's act or omission in rendering the Emergency services or aid unless that person is found grossly negligent.
- 31. Any suit brought against the Fire Chief, his designates or the duly appointed members of the Department because of such act or omission performed in carrying

out the duties outlined in this bylaw shall be defended by the Hamlet until final termination of such proceedings, and any judgment resulting there from shall be assumed by the Hamlet

- 32. The Department will have policies, standard operating guidelines, rules and regulations approved by Council necessary for the proper organization and administration of the Department, including but not limited to:
 - a) the use, care and protection of Department Apparatus, Equipment and property,
 - b) the conduct of Members, and
 - c) the general operations of the Department.
 - d) and others as required
- 33. The Fire Chief shall periodically review the policies and procedures of the Department and recommend any changes or updates to the Senior Administrative Officer. Any amendments must be approved by Council.

REQUIRING ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE

- 34. The Fire Chief, or in his absence, the officer of the Department present at any Emergency or providing and other Emergency service, shall have the right and authority to require any able-bodied person to assist in extinguishing fires, to assist in the control of spread of fire and to assist in any other required Emergency services and any person while acting under the direction of the Fire Chief, shall be deemed a volunteer of the Hamlet.
- 35. The Fire Chief, or in his absence, the Officer of the Department present at any fire or providing, and other Emergency service may request the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) to enforce restrictions on persons entering within the boundaries.
- 36. The Fire Chief, or in his absence, the Officer of the Department present at any fire or providing and other Emergency service, shall have the right and authority to commandeer and authorize payment for the possession or use of any equipment for the immediate purpose of firefighting a fire or providing any other Emergency service.

FIRE PREVENTION AND STANDARDS

- 37. All building and properties shall be adequately maintained in order to guard against fire or the risk of fire.
- 38. No burning shall be permitted within the Hamlet on a day when the wind speed exceeds ten (10) kilometers per hour.
- 39. No person shall light a fire within the Hamlet
 - a) that is not contained in a stove, furnace or any other device suitably designed and capable of containing a fire,
 - b) that is not supervised by a person who can ensure that the fire does not get out of control,
 - c) unless the clearance to any combustible material or buildings on all sides exceed nine (9) meters; and,
 - d) when the fire that the Fire Chief considers conditions to threaten persons and/or property

- 40. No burning is permitted at the Hamlet Waste Disposal Site location as defined in the "Waste Disposal Site Bylaw".
- 41. No burning of waste oil, tires, shingles, noxious, or material or products the release large quantities of smoke is permitted.
- 42. Any person must immediately extinguish any fire when required to do so by the Fire Chief.

OFFENCES AND ENFORCEMENT

- 43. Any person who hinders or obstructs the Fire Chief, his designates or duly appointed members of the Department in the exercise of their duty is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$500.00, and in default of payment of the fine, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five days.
- 44. Any person, who damages or destroys, obstructs, impedes or hinders the operation of and apparatus or equipment is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$500.00, and in default of payment of the fine, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five days.
- 45. Any person who contravenes sections 39 and 40 of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$500.00, and in default of payment of the fine, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five days.

REPEAL AND ENACTMENT

- 46. Bylaws 95, 215, and 160 are hereby repealed.
- 47. The repeal of the bylaws in section 42 should not effect:
 - a) Any penalty or proceedings for the same had it be incurred completed or
 - b) pending at the time of such appeal
- 48. Any office and appointment at the time of such repeal.

EFFECTIVE DATE


49. This bylaw shall be effective upon third and final reading.


